Each fund listed below is designated for specific purposes with the amount available noted. Minimum grant size is \$500. Grants must provide direct benefits to Frederick County, Maryland, residents only. The Impact Cycle supports two possible impacts: P means that a fund is available to support projects. IN means that a fund is available to support the needs of identified households or individuals.

- Addie B. Null Health Care Fund: \$1,383.43 (P)

To support health and wellness programs. Preference shall be given but not limited to Way Station, Inc. Criteria for the grants shall include the merit of current year programs.

- AG-C.I.T.E. Fund: \$1,585.69 (P)

To heighten awareness, promote agriculture, and provide agriculture educational activities for residents of all ages.

- Alice Jean Stine Fund: \$500.00 (P)

To support organizations benefiting cats, as well as grants for printed books for Valley Elementary School and Brunswick Elementary School.

- Animal Care Field of Interest Fund: \$1,270.10 (P)

To support all areas of animal care, including pet care, agricultural animal help, and wildlife support and rescue.

- Bar Association of Frederick County Justice for All Fund: \$16,114.72 (P)

To ensure availability of competent legal representation and/or ancillary services associated with legal representation, regardless of ability to pay. Grants may pay for services related to providing free or reduced-fee legal services, including attorney fees, lawyer referral services, translator services, and interpreters for those who are hard of hearing or do not understand English. Grants may not support criminal justice activities because of the government's affirmative obligation to provide a defense of indigent defendants or class action litigation.

- Brunswick Area Fund: \$2,527.20 (P)

To enhance the quality of life for the residents of Brunswick, Maryland.

- C & O Canal Endowment Fund for Frederick County: \$993.86 (P)

To support projects and activities relating to the preservation and heritage of The C&O Canal National Historical Park, with preference given to those portions of the Canal located in Frederick County or benefiting the residents of Frederick County.

- Charles V. and Louise D. Main Endowment Fund: \$9,219.00 (P)

To support community charitable activities and nonprofits, with special consideration given to awarding grants for special projects at Calvary United Methodist Church in Frederick.

- Compofelice Family Fund for Building Trades: \$3,073.66 (P, IN)

To support organizations seeking to help residents receive training for construction trades in the Frederick County area. Preference given to plumbing, carpentry, electrical services, masonry, and other skills associated with the building industry. Grants may pay for training, educational materials, certification fees, transportation costs, and eliminating any barrier that prevents students from completing their training program and establishing a career in the building trades.

- Dan Crozier Music Trust Fund: \$5,000.00 (P)

To promote a general appreciation of all types of music, including classical, contemporary and modern; to support musical organizations purchasing sheet music, instruments, transportation, and other necessities not otherwise available; and to underwrite the costs of band and musical concerts, especially where a grant will expand the scope of such and/or audience.

- Dola Burkentine Nonprofit Marketing Fund: \$514.41 (P)

To provide funding for marketing, advertising, fundraising, and volunteer recruitment, with preference given to organizations addressing the needs of women and children, animal adoption and community education efforts, persons with Alzheimer's Disease and their families, and those needing mental health services and with the stipulation that the grantee's mission and activities may not be against a woman's right to be "pro-choice" on issues of abortion.

- Don Doughty and Linda Moran Fund: \$1,647.34 (P)

To increase urban gardening opportunities and/or for the enhancement of public green space.

- Easels in Frederick Fund: \$1,000.00 (P)

To support art programs. Preference shall be given to but not limited to organizations supporting youth programs or plein air art.

- Educational Enrichment Field of Interest Fund: \$825.32 (P, IN)

To award scholarships for kindergarten through twelfth graders for afterschool or special programs, lessons, camps, field trips and study-abroad programs.

- England Family Fund: \$652.37 (P)

To address homelessness with a preference for programs for homeless women and their children.

- Enhancing Agriculture Field of Interest Fund: \$685.24 (P)

To support agriculture education and the promotion of agriculture.

- Environmental Preservation Field of Interest Fund: \$677.31 (P)

To support ecology initiatives and/or programs that protect the environment.

- Florence Zahler Memorial Cancer Support Fund: \$5,210.68 (P, IN)

To support individuals who have been diagnosed with cancer. Support may include assisting with housing, transportation, and/or medical insurance expenses that an individual or family may experience while having cancer.

- Frederick County AIDS/HIV Education and Services Endowment Fund: \$1,604.32 (P)

To support educational, medical, and social services to individuals diagnosed with HIV/AIDS and/or the community at large.

- Frederick Jaycees Fund: \$1,330.45 (P)

To support the betterment of Frederick County or provide financial assistance to those in need.

- Frederick Keys Care Fund: \$11,029.56 (P)

To support youth programs, with special preference for programs serving youth with disabilities, youth who have serious or terminal illness, and youth who are coping with the loss of a loved one.

- Health Fund for Frederick County Youth: \$56,473.49 (P, IN)

To support nonprofits providing services to youth under age 18 who have extraordinary and/or life-threatening medical needs.

- Historic Preservation Field of Interest Fund: \$630.34 (P)

To support of the preservation of the past, including historic landmarks, structures, and artifacts, for future generations to enjoy.

- Human Services Field of Interest Fund: \$671.10 (P, IN)

To aid individuals in mental, financial, physical need or to nonprofit organizations serving them.

- Job Training and Skills Development Field of Interest Fund: \$1,439.04 (P)

To support quality workforce development.

- John L. and Lucille H. Ponton Charitable Fund: \$104,325.42 (P, IN)

To assist youth with cancer and their families with treatment-related expenses, and to support Camp Jamie and its purposes.

- Kevin R. and Sara J. Wade Special Needs Fund: \$50,677.26 (P, IN)

To provide grants to benefit families of children experiencing a catastrophic medical condition.

- Libby Hough Van Winkle Foster Children's Fund: \$1,692.46 (IN)

To provide financial support to meet the special or unique needs of children that are not being met through normal channels. Grants could support children's medical expenses and educational needs. Preference given to serving children in foster care.

- Mary Gregg Cornish Memorial Fund: \$2,500.00 (P)

To support gardening activities with preference given but not limited to supporting community gardens and composting projects; boosting library collections related to gardening; supporting Master Gardeners activities; providing educational activities promoting gardening and the nutritional use of local produce; underwriting farmer's market activities, programs which distribute flowers to vulnerable people and the beautification of public spaces with plants and flowers; and activities which encourage children and youth to become involved with gardening.

- Mildred B. Trevvett Music Education Fund: \$922.07 (P, IN)

To support nonprofit organizations assisting with the training of music educators. Examples of these types of grants may be to support master classes, pay master class fees and/or payment of related training expenses for music educators.

- Nonprofit Support Field of Interest Fund: \$542.23 (P)

To support nonprofit infrastructure and capacity building.

- Parks Field of Interest Fund: \$782.81 (P)

To support public park enhancements.

- Paul L. Stine, Jr. Memorial Fund: \$500.00 (P)

To support nonprofits serving persons with disabilities who are mentally challenged, with special preference to Community Living, Inc. and The Arc of Frederick County. Because of Paul's love of animals, the Fund may also provide grants to organizations that provide support to animals.

- Paul L. Stine, Sr. Memorial Fund: \$500.00 (P)

To support nonprofits promoting agriculture as a career, using agriculture or farming as learning tools for youth, saving of animals such as dogs, horses, and cats from being destroyed after their productive lives are over, or providing educational opportunities for youth involved in agriculture. Primary preference is given to Maryland Agriculture Educational Foundation, Inc.

and Frederick County Therapeutic Riding Center. Additional preference given to Frederick County 4-H, Frederick County 4-H Camp Center and/or similar type organizations.

- Performing Arts Field of Interest Fund: \$687.01 (P, IN)

To support the performing arts, including dance, musical, theatrical, and live performances produced by nonprofit organizations, and individual lessons for students studying the performing arts at any level.

- Persons with Disabilities Field of Interest Fund: \$1035.71 (P, IN)

To aid individuals with disabilities.

- Philip and Erika Rauh Fund: \$6,779.57 (P, IN)

To support services and programs related to the needs of children.

- Pritchett Family Foundation Fund: \$1,660.00 (P)

To support programs for children with physical disabilities and/or children with financial need.

- Recreation Field of Interest Fund: \$601.07 (P)

To support play areas, sporting events, festivals, and teams/leagues.

- Remsberg Family Fund: \$2,256.41 (P)

To support nonprofits providing health care, with primary preference given to the provision of mental health services and secondary preference given to the provision of behavioral health services, including substance use treatment programs.

- Rhema H. Fogle Memorial Endowment Fund: \$7,120.43 (IN)

To provide financial support for emergency assistance to needy people who have suffered from fires, floods and other like catastrophes.

- Secret Santa Fund: \$1,317.91 (P, IN)

To support nonprofits providing services to residents who are experiencing hardships where a small “hand-up” could positively change a dire situation.

- Rosebud Frederick Senior Support Fund: \$500.00 (P, IN)

To support the needs of senior citizens. Grants from this Fund shall support basic human needs, therapeutic, socialization, recreation, nutrition, adapting their physical environments, and other areas that enable senior citizens to live healthier lives and to age in place. Preference shall be given to but not limited to supporting the programs provided by the Frederick Senior Center.

- Sharon I. Hooper Fund for Children: \$15,544.52 (P, IN)

To support programs serving youth, with preference given to services for families with children

with catastrophic illnesses, which may include: paying for medical care, providing respite care for caregivers, offering babysitters for siblings while parents are involved with the ill child's treatment, providing mental health services, and giving recreational opportunities to families to relieve stress and to divert constant attention from the child's illness.

- Transportation Field of Interest Fund: \$950.94 (P)

To support transportation concerns, with particular focus on those with disabilities, who are elderly, and who are low-income.

- Visual Arts Field of Interest Fund: \$726.86 (P, IN)

To support all areas of the visual arts, including painting, sculpture, photography, and architecture, by awarding grants to nonprofits and scholarships to individuals pursuing training in the visual arts.

- William E. Barnhart Memorial Fund: \$32,433.64 (P, IN)

To support nonprofits that assist residents who have cancer or to support organizations that provide direct services to persons with cancer.

- William E. Cross Special Needs Fund: \$3,730.24 (P, IN)

To support nonprofits that assist individuals affected by catastrophic circumstances, such as life-threatening illnesses, medical conditions that hamper activities of daily living, loss of financial livelihood, death of an immediate family member, involvement in accidents that cause a dramatic change in physical and mental well-being, or the absence of a family support system. The grant is intended to make a difference in the recipients' quality of life, living situation and ability to sustain themselves.

- William O. Lee, Jr. and Family Endowment Fund: \$610.53 (P)

To award grants to nonprofits that are researching, restoring, archiving, cataloging, and educating the community in areas pertaining to African American history in Frederick County.

- Unrestricted Grant Fund: \$64,331.66 (P)

To support nonprofits that have a meaningful, direct impact in any field of interest.
