# GRANT SAMPLER

This is a sampling of grants that were provided to local nonprofits during fiscal year 2021.

In 2021, the Community Foundation remained committed to supporting our community as it began to come out of the pandemic.



Grants from **The Feeding Frederick's Frontline Fund** provided free meals to Frederick's frontline workers and supported downtown Frederick restaurants during the pandemic. Grants supported meals from local restaurants for health care workers, emergency workers, shelter providers, and other government or nonprofit workers who worked with COVID patients or persons at high risk of COVID.



Thanks to grants from **The John L. and Lucille H. Ponton Charitable Fund** and **The Health Fund for Frederick County Youth**, this young girl's parents were able to receive lodging assistance and family resources while she was receiving active oncology treatment at Children's National Hospital, located over an hour from their home in Frederick.

Grants from **The D. Hunt and Joan Hendrickson Fund** and **The Walter W. and Catharine Prentiss Plummer Endowment Fund** provided support for Chesapeake Bay Foundation's local projects that are critical to water quality and those living downstream. A group of staff and volunteers is pictured here planting trees on a farm in Frederick. By planting trees near streams, the flow of harmful pollutants into the sensitive waters of the Chesapeake Bay watershed is slowed.



A grant from **The Frederick County Business Roundtable for Education Fund** supported the Frederick County Public Schools Youth Apprenticeship Program. The program, now in 18 school districts across the state, pairs students with a mentor in a state-approved industry to learn valuable skills and earn industry credentials while receiving high school credit. The grant supported Olivia Sullivan, a senior at Tuscarora High School, who was a youth apprentice at Frederick Health Hospital in its Biomedical Engineering Department. She assisted with testing medical equipment and accessories.



Partners in Care received grants from **The Health Care Strategic Initiatives Fund** and **The Partners in Care Fund** to support its mission of offering services and programs that allow greater independence for older adults. This includes transportation for medical appointments, handyman repairs, person-centered support, and social engagement. In this photo, a woman is receiving a ride for a scheduled appointment.



A grant from **The Responding to Substance Use Disorder Strategic Initiatives Fund** supported Phoenix Foundation of Maryland's Phoenix Recovery Academy, which is a recovery high school that meets the individual educational needs of teens recovering from substance use disorder with care, compassion, respect, and rigor. Phoenix Foundation also received support from **unrestricted funds** for security and technology needs at Phoenix Recovery Academy.


