

FY2026 Impact Grant Funds List as of 10/6/2025

Each fund listed below is designated for specific purposes with the amount available noted. Minimum grant size is \$500. **Grants must provide direct benefits to Frederick County, Maryland, residents unless otherwise noted.**

The Impact Cycle supports two possible impacts:

P means that a fund is available to support projects.

IN means that a fund is available to support identified households or individuals.

The applicant organization must be:

- An already existing nonprofit, 501c3 organization in good standing with the IRS,
- An existing government/quasi-governmental entity applying for an extraordinary project that is not funded by tax revenue,
- · A faith-based organization requesting funding for non-sectarian activities, or
- A civic group that is not a 501c3 organization requesting funding for a community cause.

The list of available grants and their respective criteria are as follows:

• Addie B. Null Health Care Fund:

\$3,023.33 (P)

Founded by Ms. Null to support health and wellness programs. Preference given but not limited to Sheppard Pratt.

• AG-C.I.T.E. Fund:

\$1,724.22 (P)

Founded by Kaitlyn, Ashley, David, and Katherine Fuss with Robert and Susie Fogle to heighten awareness, promote agriculture, and provide agriculture educational activities for all ages.

• Alvin F. Tesmer and John J. Hayes Veterans Memorial Fund: \$3,069.23 (P)

Founded by John J. and Kay L. Hayes to support veterans and their immediate family including caregivers, spouses, and children in Frederick County and Carroll County with preference for services addressing basic human needs, behavioral health, or direct medical care.

• <u>Animal Care Field of Interest Fund:</u>

\$1,420.57 (P)

Founded by the Community Foundation to support all areas of animal care, including pet care, agricultural animal help, and wildlife support and rescue.

- Bar Association of Frederick County Justice for All Fund: \$20,000.00 (P)
 Founded by the Bar Association to ensure availability of competent legal representation for residents regardless of their ability to pay. Grants may pay for services related to providing free or reduced-fee legal services, including attorney fees, lawyer referral services, translator services, and interpreters for those who are hard of hearing or do not understand English. Grants may not support criminal justice activities because of the government's affirmative obligation to provide a defense of indigent defendants or class action litigation.
- Brunswick Area Fund: \$2,719.06 (P)
 Founded by the Honorable and Mrs. William Wenner to enhance the quality of life for the residents of Brunswick, Maryland.
- Brunswick Community Medical Fund: \$12,391.91 (P)
 Founded by Brunswick Medical Center, Inc. to support nonprofits offering medical assistance to Brunswick residents.
- Charles V. and Louise D. Main Endowment Fund: \$10,251.65 (P)
 Founded through Mr. Main's bequest to support community charitable activities, with a preference for projects at Calvary United Methodist Church in Frederick.
- Christopher and Lucia Kline Family Charitable Fund: \$2,956.04 (P)
 Founded by the Klines to support nonprofits that provide mental health services and programs for dyslexia disorder.
- Compofelice Family Fund for Building Trades:
 Founded by Susan C. Compofelice to help residents receive training for construction trades in Frederick County. Preference given to plumbing, carpentry, electrical services, masonry, and other skills associated with the building industry. Grants may pay for training, educational materials, certification fees, transportation costs, and eliminating any barrier that prevents students from completing their training program and establishing a career in the building trades.
- <u>Dan Crozier Music Trust Fund</u>:

 Founded with proceeds from the Dan Crozier Music Trust to support music appreciation, grants to musical organizations, concerts, and music scholarships for sheet music, instruments and other necessary supplies and materials, and to underwrite the costs of presenting and expanding the number of band and musical concerts.
- <u>David J. and Sara R. Levine Fund</u>: \$1,275.86 (P)
 Founded by the Levines to support health and wellness initiatives and/or services to households experiencing homelessness with preference for supporting children who are experiencing homelessness.
- Don't Just Stand There, DO SOMETHING Fund: \$1,667.95 (P)
 Founded by Gwen Romack and Evan Somerstein to support programs addressing youth homelessness or homeless families with children. Preference given to Student Homelessness Initiative Partnership, Inc. (SHIP).

• Dr. George and Carolyn Smith Fund:

\$831.95 (P)

Founded by the Smiths to support the performing and visual arts, with preference given to offering art classes, art exhibits, concerts to be enjoyed by the general public, music instruction for underserved populations, community theater productions, and other activities that enhance Frederick County's status as an arts destination.

• Dr. Larry J. Warner Fund:

\$1,362.41 (P)

Founded by wife Natalie R. Warner to fund programs for nontraditional learners, with preference for programs offered through Allied Health Academy at Frederick Community College. Special consideration for programs assisting English-language learners, providing financial literacy, or helping people break the cycle of poverty.

• Earlene H. and Henry J. Sr. Thornton Fund for Education: \$621.40 (P)

Founded by Earlene Hairston Thornton to support special projects with an education focus that enhance the learning ability of students. Special consideration will be given to projects or programs benefitting students attending Middletown High School or its feeder schools.

• Easels in Frederick Fund:

\$4,718.12 (P)

Founded by Easels in Frederick to support art programs, with preference given to youth programs or plein air art.

• Edgar and Geraldine Virts Memorial Fund:

\$3,315.40 (P)

Founded by Edgar Virts to support nonprofits serving persons with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders, people with disabilities and/or the provision of direct patient care to persons experiencing catastrophic health issues.

• Educational Enrichment Field of Interest Fund:

\$918.72 (P)

Founded by the Community Foundation to support opportunities for kindergarten through twelfth graders to experience after school or special programs, lessons, camps, field trips or study-abroad programs.

• Edwin R. Cornish, Jr. Memorial Fund:

\$3,003.02 (P)

Founded by Erin Cornish to support services to nontraditional learners. Preference given to programs targeting individuals changing careers after job loss or limitations, learning technological advances to be more relevant, seeking alternative learning opportunities, having limited support or needing new skills for employment, or overcoming other obstacles to employment such as certifications and literacy.

Founded by Harold and Anna Emmons to support nonprofit organizations that serve the aging population or individuals with disabilities.

Founded by parents Kevin and Nicolette Moberly to support individuals who are born with special needs, specifically developmental delays that require specialized care and support so that they can live a barrier-free lifestyle. Preference shall be given to providing adaptive equipment, adaptive transportation needs, adaptive communication devices, home adaptation for handicap/wheelchair access, and short-term caregiver respite (non-skilled, up to 3 days).

Founded by Robert and Carolyn Moroney to support initiatives that foster the well-being of the feline population.

• Florence Zahler Memorial Cancer Support Fund:

Founded by Nelson S. and Celia E. Zahler to support residents who have been diagnosed with cancer.
