

FY2026 Rolling Grant Funds List as of 1/05/2026

Each fund listed below is designated for specific purposes with the amount available noted. Minimum grant size is \$500. **Grants must provide direct benefits to Frederick County, Maryland, residents unless otherwise noted.**

The Rolling grant Cycle supports two possible impacts:

P means that a fund is available to support projects.

IN means that a fund is available to support identified households or individuals.

The applicant organization must be:

- An already existing nonprofit, 501c3 organization in good standing with the IRS,
- An existing government/quasi-governmental entity applying for an extraordinary project that is not funded by tax revenue,
- · A faith-based organization requesting funding for non-sectarian activities, or
- A civic group that is not a 501c3 organization requesting funding for a community cause.

The list of available grants and their respective criteria are as follows:

Brunswick Community Medical Fund: Founded by Brunswick Medical Center, Inc. to support nonprofits that support medical related programs to individuals residing in the Brunswick Area, defined by those that live with the Brunswick High School District. Programs include assistance with medical bills, medical transportation, support for individuals with special needs, and any other medical, dental, behavioral heath needs in the Brunswick Area.

- Christopher and Lucia Kline Family Charitable Fund: \$956.04 (P)
 Founded by the Klines to support nonprofits providing services to address mental health and dyslexia for the direct benefit of Frederick County residents
- Compofelice Family Fund for Building Trades: \$8,261.53 (P, IN)
 Founded by Susan C. Compofelice to help residents receive training for
 construction trades in Frederick County. Preference given to plumbing, carpentry,
 electrical services, masonry, and other skills associated with the building industry.
 Grants may pay for training, educational materials, certification fees, transportation
 costs, and eliminating any barrier that prevents students from completing their
 training program and establishing a career in the building trades.

• Erin Christine Moberly Memorial Fund:

\$1,607.10 (P, IN)

Founded by parents Kevin and Nicolette Moberly to support individuals who are born with special needs, specifically developmental delays that require specialized care and support so that they can live a barrier-free lifestyle. Preference shall be given to providing adaptive equipment, adaptive transportation needs, adaptive communication devices, home adaptation for handicap/wheelchair access, and short-term caregiver respite (non-skilled, up to 3 days).

- Frederick County Cardiac Services and Prevention Fund: \$1,166.39 (P)
 Founded by Donald C. Linton for programs supporting cardiac health, including prevention and education programs, as well as programs that address the needs of people with cardiac disease.
- Health Fund for Frederick County Youth: \$2,178.83 (P, IN)
 Founded by Donald C. Linton to provide services to youth under age 18 who have extraordinary and/or life-threatening medical needs. Such needs might include but are not limited to, transplant surgery, burn treatment and surgery, special equipment needs, plastic and orthopedic surgery related to a congenital disorder.
- <u>Historic Preservation Field of Interest Fund</u>: \$678.05 (P) Founded by the Community Foundation to preserve the past, including historic landmarks, structures, and artifacts, for future generations to enjoy.
- Holly Hale Palmer Memorial Fund:

 Founded by Mother Elizabeth K. Hale to support behavioral health services for persons with seizure or bipolar disorders, with special emphasis on acquiring, training, and caring for service dogs for persons with seizure or bipolar disorders.
- J. Howard, Mary R. and Leah C. Schroyer Fund: \$1,374.73 (P)
 Founded through Leah Schroyer's estate provisions to support programs to aid individuals with disabilities and any catastrophic causes for persons in need with preference for Advocates for Homeless Families, Inc. and Heartly House, Inc.
- John C. Summers Fund:
 \$3,359.39 (P, IN)

 Founded through Mr. Summers' trust to support individuals residing in Myersville,
 Maryland, who are experiencing difficulty in paying their utility bills or their real property
 taxes.
- Johnson STEM Education Fund:
 Founded by Patrick and Virginia Johnson to support Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) programs and STEM experiential learning opportunities. It is the donor's intention to support direct program cost of STEM programs and learning opportunities but not professional development, building construction or facility maintenance.
- Kevin R. and Sara J. Wade Special Needs Fund: \$21,183.90 (P, IN)
 Founded by the Wades' estate to benefit families of children experiencing a catastrophic medical condition.

Martha Murphy Virts Memorial Fund:

\$3,876.91 (P)

Founded by Edgar C. Virts, Jr. to support programs serving people with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders, assisting people with disabilities, or providing direct care to people experiencing catastrophic health issues.

Mildred B. Trevvett Music Education Fund:

\$1,051.50 (P, IN)

Founded by niece Jane Clark Peluso to support the training of music educators, including but not limited to grants to support master classes, to pay master class fees and/or related training expenses for music educators.

• Parks Field of Interest Fund:

\$886.49 (P)

Founded by the Community Foundation to support public park enhancements.

Refugee Support Fund:

\$1,243.36 (P)

Founded by Covenant Capital, LLC to support nonprofits in Washington, D.C., Maryland, and the northern Virginia region with a preference for Frederick County, Maryland, area providing services for refugee programs for people who have been forced to flee their country because of persecution, natural disaster, war or violence.

• Rick Topper Charitable Fund:

\$2,000.00 (P)

Founded by family members to support organizations helping students attain a career in the construction trades.

• Robert Ryals Memorial Endowment Fund:

\$1,512.59 (P)

Founded by Gloria Jean Ryals to support research, treatment, and/or care impacting persons with severe mental illness. Preference given but not limited to programs addressing schizophrenia.

William and Hettie Ballweber Fund:

\$3,211.38 (P)

Founded by wife Hettie Ballweber to support initiatives around canine welfare, including but not limited to public education on animal abuse and neglect, spay/neuter programs, the avoidance of euthanasia except in medically humane situations, and the promotion of pet adoption by individuals and families who take their responsibility seriously, with the welfare of the dog foremost. It is not the intent to support animal shelters or the care of animals within shelters.
