



FY2026 Rolling Grant Funds List as of 4/10/2026

Each fund listed below is designated for specific purposes with the amount available noted. Minimum grant size is \$500. **Grants must provide direct benefits to Frederick County, Maryland, residents unless otherwise noted.**

The Rolling grant Cycle supports two possible impacts:

P means that a fund is available to support projects.

IN means that a fund is available to support identified households or individuals.

The applicant organization must be:

- An already existing nonprofit, 501c3 organization in good standing with the IRS,
- An existing government/quasi-governmental entity applying for an extraordinary project that is not funded by tax revenue,
- A faith-based organization requesting funding for non-sectarian activities, or
- A civic group that is not a 501c3 organization requesting funding for a community cause.

The list of available grants and their respective criteria are as follows:

- **Brunswick Community Medical Fund:** **\$7,391.91 (P)**
Founded by Brunswick Medical Center, Inc. to support nonprofits that support medical related programs to individuals residing in the Brunswick Area, defined by those that live with the Brunswick High School District. Programs include assistance with medical bills, medical transportation, support for individuals with special needs, and any other medical, dental, behavioral health needs in the Brunswick Area.
- **Christopher and Lucia Kline Family Charitable Fund:** **\$956.04 (P)**
Founded by the Klins to support nonprofits providing services to address mental health and dyslexia for the direct benefit of Frederick County residents
- **Compofelice Family Fund for Building Trades:** **Awarded**
- **Dr. Harding W. Olson Patient Aid Fund:** **\$7,637.19 (P)**
Founded by Frederick County Mental Health Services to support programs that help Frederick County residents access prescription medications for mental health.
- **Erin Christine Moberly Memorial Fund:** **Awarded**
- **Frederick County Cardiac Services and Prevention Fund:** **Awarded**
- **Health Fund for Frederick County Youth:** **Awarded**

- **Historic Preservation Field of Interest Fund:** **\$678.05 (P)**
Founded by the Community Foundation to preserve the past, including historic landmarks, structures, and artifacts, for future generations to enjoy.
- **Holly Hale Palmer Memorial Fund:** **\$88,908.37 (P)**
Founded by Mother Elizabeth K. Hale to support behavioral health services for persons with seizure or bipolar disorders, with special emphasis on acquiring, training, and caring for service dogs for persons with seizure or bipolar disorders.
- **J. Howard, Mary R. and Leah C. Schroyer Fund:** **Awarded**
- **John C. Summers Fund:** **Awarded**
- **Johnson STEM Education Fund:** **Awarded**
- **Kevin R. and Sara J. Wade Special Needs Fund:** **Awarded**
- **Martha Murphy Virts Memorial Fund:** **Awarded**
- **Mildred B. Trevvett Music Education Fund:** **\$1,051.50 (P, IN)**
Founded by niece Jane Clark Peluso to support the training of music educators, including but not limited to grants to support master classes, to pay master class fees and/or related training expenses for music educators.
- **Parks Field of Interest Fund:** **\$886.49 (P)**
Founded by the Community Foundation to support public park enhancements.
- **Refugee Support Fund:** **\$1,243.36 (P)**
Founded by Covenant Capital, LLC to support nonprofits in Washington, D.C., Maryland, and the northern Virginia region with a preference for Frederick County, Maryland, area providing services for refugee programs for people who have been forced to flee their country because of persecution, natural disaster, war or violence.
- **Rick Topper Charitable Fund:** **Awarded**
- **Robert Ryals Memorial Endowment Fund:** **\$1,512.59 (P)**
Founded by Gloria Jean Ryals to support research, treatment, and/or care impacting persons with severe mental illness. Preference given but not limited to programs addressing schizophrenia.
- **William and Hettie Ballweber Fund:** **\$3,211.38 (P)**
Founded by wife Hettie Ballweber to support initiatives around canine welfare, including but not limited to public education on animal abuse and neglect, spay/neuter programs, the avoidance of euthanasia except in medically humane situations, and the promotion of pet adoption by individuals and families who take their responsibility seriously, with the welfare of the dog foremost. It is not the intent to support animal shelters or the care of animals within shelters.
